Project opportunities for our Pukehina Community

There are already some fantastic projects happening right here in Pukehina - driven by community passion and long-term planning.

Through the repurposing of the Pukehina Development Fund, we now have a shared opportunity to support and strengthen these projects together. It's about making sure the fund benefits our community in ways that matter most to us.





Following community feedback during the 2025 Annual Plan consultation, Western Bay of Plenty District Council (WBOPDC) made the decision to stop and repurpose the Pukehina Development Fund (PDF) to support existing community projects in the Pukehina area.

What's happening now?

The Pukehina Residents and Ratepayers Association (PRRA), with support from WBOPDC, is leading the next phase of community consultation. We're inviting your input on how the PDF should be distributed among a range of existing community projects - identified through long-term planning and previous community korero. Our goal is to make sure the fund is used in a way that brings benefits - both for you and the whole community.

Fishing Club - Building maintenance, community fishing events, investigation into a potential jetty. Surf Club - Assistance for building completion and Junior Surf Programme equipment. Community Hall - Equipment housed at the Hall for use by community e.g., kitchen equipment, new tables, outdoor community notice board, lay a concrete path at rear of building. Fire Brigade - To support services to our community.
